Report on the audit of the Standalone Financial Statements

**Opinion** 

We have audited the accompanying standalone Financial Statements of NRI INVESTMENTS LIMITED ("the Company"), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at 31<sup>st</sup> March 2022, and the Statement of Profit & Loss (including other Comprehensive Income), the Statement of Changes in Equity and the Statement of Cash Flows for the year ended on that date, and notes to the Financial Statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information (hereinafter referred to as "the standalone financial statements").

# Note No. - 1 Significant Accounting Policies

#### (i) Basis of preparation of financial statements

The Financial Statements of the company are prepared in accordance with Indian Accounting Standards (Ind AS), including the rules notified under the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 2013, amended from

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost convention on the accrual basis except for the investments other than associates which have been measured at fair value amount.

The Company's Financial Statements are presented in Indian Rupees which is also its functional currency, and all values are rounded to the nearest rupee, except when otherwise indicated.

The carrying amount of deferred tax assets is reviewed at the end of each reporting period and reduced to the extent that it is no longer probable that sufficient taxable profits will be available to allow all or part of the asset to be recovered
